The Rising to the Throne

- 1547, Henry VIII's death
- Catherine Parr married Thomas Seymour
- 1549, Scandal at court
- Seymour was sentenced to death



The Rising to the Throne

- Edward became sick, Mary would succeed her brother
- John Dudley, Duke of Northumberland, excluded Mary and Elizabeth
- Lady Jane Grey married John's son, Guilford Dudley



The Rising to the Throne

- 1553, Edward died, Lady Jane Grey was proclaimed Queen
- 19 July 1553, Mary organised an army
- Mary I became Queen
- Elizabeth supported Mary with 2,000 horsemen



The Rising to the Throne

- Mary would restored the connection to Rome's Church
- She would married Philip of Spain
- The citizenry disagreed and marched to London



The Rising to the Throne

- The citizenry wanted Elizabeth to be the Queen
- She was accused to have been conspiring with Wyatt and she was sent to the Tower's tradesmen's entrance



The Rising to the Throne

- Jane Grey was executed
- She was released to the Tower cause the lack of evidence
- She was placed in to the Manor of Woodstock, the Blenheim Palace



The Rising to the Throne

- Mary became sick and Philip left England because she didn't give to him a child
- Mary died, and Elizabeth carefully planned the beginnings of her reign



The Rising to the Throne

- Elizabeth nominated William Cecil as her principal advisor
- William served the Queen for 40 years, first as Secretary of State and as Lord Tesorier
