

Mixed conditionals can be tricky, as they aren't as distinctive as the other conditionals, yet they are nevertheless terribly useful

This is when the time of the if-clause is different to the time of the result

PAST

If I had studied harder,
If he had been to Cyprus,
If she had known English,
If he had won the lottery,

PRESENT

I would be at University.
he would know that they drive on the left there.
she would have that job.
he would be rich.

PAST

If she had had more money,
If I had gotten that job,
If I had been born in England,
If they hadn't broken the window,

FUTURE

she would be joining us for the ski trip.
I would be starting tomorrow.
I wouldn't have to go to the consulate next week.
we wouldn't have to go to court.

PRESENT

If I spoke German,
If I lived in England,
If I was a gardener,
If I didn't work so hard,

PAST

I would have applied for the position.
I would have gone to the London Olympics.
I would have bought a garden.
I could have gone to the concert.
