ACTIVITY 1. VERB TENSES

13. I (to buy) a new car: it is old and slow. I **AM GOING TO BUY** a new car : it is old and slow.

15. I (to love) her since I first met her. **I HAVE LOVED/I HAVE BEEN LOVING** her since I first met her.
