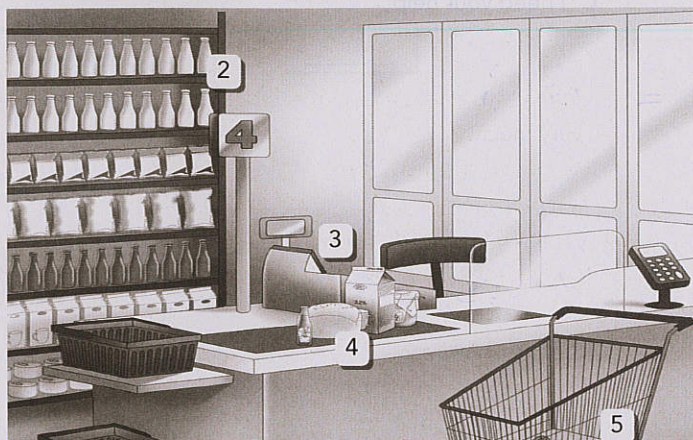

We usually buy one or two bars of chocolate to make cakes. We always buy some fruit like apples, grapes or oranges, and sometimes also some carrots or some tomatoes.
