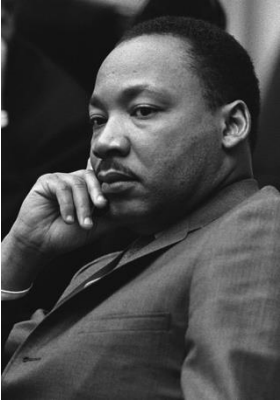


# MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.



*"I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the colour of their skin, but by the content of their character."*

**August 28, 1963** → King gives his "I Have A Dream" speech

*"Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that".*

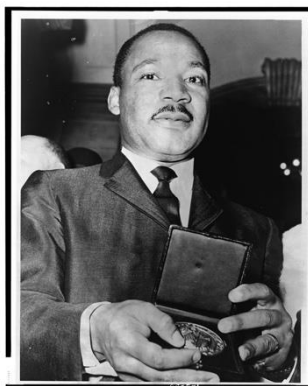
**April 4, 1968** → King is assassinated in Memphis

## Dr. M. L. King's message

- eliminate racism and segregation from the world.
- men and women, black or white were equal members of the human race,
- everyone can be great
- everybody can be a servant
- you do not need to have, to do and to know nothing to serve, as long as you have a heart.
- everyone does not have to have anything to be ashamed of.
- the word "black" is generally connected to something low, bad and sinister
- the word "white" generally refers to something pure and good.
- black and white are only colours.

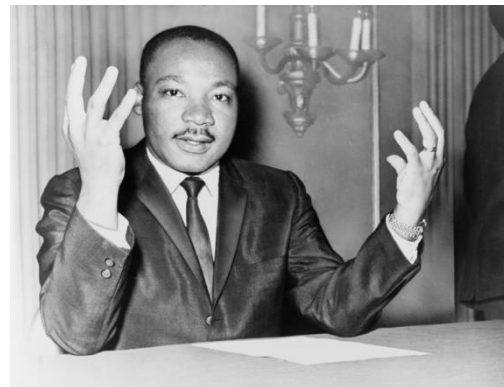
- everyone should have his liberty
- everyone should receive love
- everyone should be accepted because everyone is perfect as he is.



**January 15, 1929** → Martin Luther King is born in Atlanta, Georgia

*"The ultimate tragedy is not the oppression and cruelty by the bad people but the silent over that by the good people"*

**December 10, 1964** → M. L. King wins the Nobel Peace Prize



On the 4<sup>th</sup> April 1968, Martin Luther King was assassinated

He went to Memphis to march with the sanitation workers.

3<sup>rd</sup> April 1968 ⇔ held his last speech: he said he had received lots of letters

- from the president,
- from the vice president,
- from the governor of NYC but he had forgotten them,
- he had also received a letter from a white girl but he had not forgotten it because the girl was very happy that he didn't sneeze.

## What life was like in the 1960s

1960ies: black people didn't live a simple life:

they couldn't go to restaurants where white people went  
schools were separated.

**Black people had to**

- bring respect to whites and
- follow certain rules to submit to them.
