There are now over ten billion web pages and over a hundred thousand new ones are added each week. The Google search engine was launched in 1998 and today around a billion searches are made daily. P2P music file sharing became widely available in 2003 and today over a million songs are downloaded every hour. The internet is used regularly by over a billion people worldwide.
